In Math the students tallied and graphed the results of who is afraid of spiders © It was fun to watch the student's faces as they answered the question. The students also revisited 2D shapes and put them in a spider web. From there, they colored each shape a certain color based on the key. The students also worked with tens frames (adding spiders together then writing a number sentence, gluing number spiders in order from 1 - 20 on a tens frame, and working with fact families to ten). We concluded the week working in small groups for math centers.

Next week our theme will be on Thanksgiving, pilgrims, and Native Americans. We will discuss the many reasons we



have for being thankful, the Mayflower, and the first Thanksgiving feast. In Math we will work with pattern blocks making shapes and images, addition story problems about Thanksgiving, and fact families to ten.
