This week we met Mr. D. Mr. D does a dazzling dance in his
 daring dance costume! We discussed words that begin with /d/ sound and we talked about the different sounds Dd can make. There is the /d/ sound in DeBoer (Joslyn and Kolton's last name), Dice (Jaxon's last name), dog, duck, doctor, and doughnut. There is also the /t/ sound in stopped, talked, and walked. We also discussed the softer sound Dd can make in middle, griddle, and fiddle. See how many words you and your child can spot that contain the letter Dd while you are out and about.

Our theme of the week was on Thanksgiving, the pilgrims and Native Americans. We talked about how the pilgrims came to America on the Mayflower and docked at Plymouth Rock. The students learned how the Native Americans taught
 the pilgrims how to grow corn, berries, etc. and how to hunt for food and survive the long, cold winters. We also discussed how we all have many things to be 'thankful" for. Please discuss with your child what things you are thankful for $\odot$

In math, the students worked with pattern blocks and made many different designs. Some of the images the students designed included: bird, flower,
 flag, car, boat, fish, train, and dog. It was awesome to watch them be creative and bring the blocks to life - The students
also worked with a dice game finding numbers to ten, solving addition story problems, and building a turkey jigsaw puzzle.

Next week we will continue our theme on Thanksgiving. The
 students will join the other Kindergarten classes to enjoy a "Thanksgiving Feast" with popcorn, pumpkin bars, and beef sticks for snack. We will review letters, sounds, and numbers.
