We discussed words that begin with the /i/ sound such as igloo, inch, insects, instruments, and many others! Ask your child to list as many words as they can that begin with Ii! We also read the poem The Littlest Worm. In the poem a little girl has a worm in her juice straw and she sips it down! Yuck! Discuss this fun poem with your child and see what they can remember.

This week our theme was about bats. We learned many



interesting facts about bats. Some of our favorite facts include: bats are mammals, bats are nocturnal, bats can fly, bats have 4 fingers and a small thumb, bats find food and locate objects

In Math the students used many nonstandard forms of measurement to measure things throughout the room.
