This week our letter focus was on Qq. We met Mr. Q with his questions. Our class agreed that this letter was much harder to think of words that started with Qq. Our list we thought of included: quilt, queen, quail, quarter, quart, Quincy, quack, quick, quit, quite, quiz, and question. Ask your child if they can help you think of any more words to add to the list.

Another topic we discussed is how almost always in words when you have a letter $q$ it is followed by a $u$.

With our word building activities, we changed out the ending sounds. The words we worked with included: quick, quit, quack, and quiz. Please continue to help your child hear
 beginning, medal, and ending sounds when word building.

In Math, the students learned a fun game called Closest to Ten.
Each student chooses three cards. With those three cards, the student must decide which two cards when added together would get them "closest to ten." This game is a great way to incorporate the counting on strategy as well as learning addition facts. We also sorted and graphed bunny marshmallows. The students enjoyed graphing but mostly eating the treat in the end $)^{-}$

Next week our focus theme will be spring. We will be learning about our last letter of the alphabet; letter Xx. In Math we will continue to solve addition and subtraction problems in story problems, counting on strategies, counting by 2,5 , and 10 s, and ways to make a given number.
