Dear Parents and Guardians,

Only 6 more school days until the $100^{\text {th }}$ day of school! All the students are so excited to celebrate this special day. Each day the countdown is on, one day closer to the fun day.

Our letter of the week was Ww. The students brainstormed words that started with Ww which included: winter, watch, weather, will, when, water, watermelon, window, woman, walk, and walrus. Please continue to think of more words to add to the
 list with your child at home. We also met our letter person, Ms. W with her wonderful words. We found her "hidden letters" when she winks. Our poem of the week was "A Wise Old Owl." We discussed how we are like/different from a wise old owl. Another skill we worked on this week is building words with Ww. We used the letters I, n, p, s, t, and w. We would spell out rhyming words by changing the beginning sound (ex: Start with pin and make a new word by changing the /p/ to a/w/.

Our theme of the week was snow and mittens. We read the book,
 The Mitten, by Jan Brett. In the story a little boy drops one of the mittens his grandma just made for him. Throughout the story a new animal enters the mitten to find a warm, dry spot to sleep. Please ask your child to retell the story. Story pieces were sent home earlier this week to sequence the animals :)

In Math the students focused on writing fact families. Although this is a tough skill, the students seem to be picking up on this rather quickly. Please continue to practice this at home. We practiced counting by 10's to 100, discussed the tens column, and revisited the tens frame. Along with the items above, we solved story

problems in our math journals. The students have shared some interesting thoughts on how they arrived at their answer!

Next week our letter focus of the week will be on Oo. We will also learn about Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and why he is such an important influence in our lives. Please talk with your child about who he was and why he changed the lives of all Americans. Our theme will also include hibernation. We will learn all about hibernation, which animals hibernate in the winter, and why they hibernate. In Math we will order numbers from smallest to largest, compare quantities using a tens frame, and solving math problems in our journals.
